- Clients are asked to visit the centre unaccompanied. All scheduled appointments will be a maximum of one hour in length. Please arrive 15 minutes early to your appointment to complete a screening process. Walk-in visits to our Job Searc h Centre will be limited based on gathering restrictions.
- When you arrive you will be asked to complete a screening questionnaire. If you are feeling unwell, please visit us another time. For your convenience, we can also serve you by phone or email.
- Hand sanitizer is available as you enter the centre. Please sanitize your hands. Offices and computer stations will be sanitized in-between clients.
- There will be no waiting area available for client use






