

Covid-19 Safety Precautions

- All services are **by appointment only.** Clients are asked to be unaccompanied. All appointments will be a maximum of one hour in length. Please arrive 15 minutes early to your appointment to complete a screening process.
- You will be called 24 hours prior to your appointment to complete a **screening questionnaire.** This will then be completed in-person when you arrive for your appointment. If you are feeling unwell, please reschedule your appointment. We can also serve you by phone or email.
- Hand sanitizer is available as you enter the centre. Please sanitize your hands.
- When you arrive for your appointment, please press the doorbell and wait outside until one of our staff comes to get you. We are sanitizing in between appointments.
- There will be no waiting area or washroom facilities available for client use
- When entering the centre, please wear a mask. If you do not have one, one will be provided.




